Selection criteria

- Completion of: CHC33021 Certificate III in Individual Support (Disability); OR CHC33015 Certificate III in Individual Support (Disability); OR CHC30408 Certificate III in Disability PLUS the CHCSSOO125 Entry to Certificate IV in Disability Support Skill Set.
- Must be over the age of 18 years
- Willingness to complete a Police Check Record
- Successful completion of an LLND test
- Willingness to complete a Working with Children's Check
- Must have computer with internet access
- Must have a camera, microphone and capacity to upload simulations
- Willingness to complete NDIS Worker Screening Check
- Prior professional experience in another sector.





Mode of assessment



Online assessment

You'll complete short answer questions, long answer questions, scenario-based questions, and multiple-choice questions to show what you know in different ways.



Case studies

You'll complete case study questions that let you apply your knowledge to real-life examples. This gives you a chance to use your skills in a practical context.



Portfolio of evidence

During work placement, you'll collect a portfolio of evidence to show your skills and knowledge. This portfolio will be made up of workplace documents, work samples, notes and meeting minutes.



Work placement assessment

During work placement, you'll be observed and assessed in a real-time working environment or in a simulated environment that reflects workplace conditions.



Third party reports

Sometimes your assessor can't be there to watch you work. Third Party Reports fills that gap by giving your assessor a clear picture of your performance from a supervisor or manager who has observed you in the workplace.
